Social Media Sunday is the day set aside for Christians everywhere to use digital devices intentionally to share their life of faith with the world. Started at Trinity Episcopal Church in Tariffville, Conn., in 2013, Social Media Sunday has grown since then to include people of faith everywhere.

What can people do on Social Media Sunday to share their faith? (just be sure your phone is set not to ring)

- Facebook: check-in and update your status to let your friends know you are at church, or share a short video
- Twitter: tweet parts of the sermon
- Instagram: share a photo or selfie from your church, or create an Insta story of the service
- Snapchat: snap a story from the service
- YouTube: video a snippet of the service – maybe of the choir – on your phone and upload it
- Pinterest: make a Pinboard of your church and share something from your church's website
- Hashtag: be certain to use #SMS17 on everything you post
