Cathedral to host MIQRA this weekend!

MIQRA is a weekend retreat for our Diocesan youth that focuses on the Bible and allows teens to discover what's in it, why we should care, and how to read it. Along with workshops and activities, the entire Bible from Genesis to Revelation is read aloud in 72 hours! The reading is voluntary and participants take turns reading in shifts around the clock beginning at 9 a.m. on Friday, January 18.
